




made from #6 plastic

- Locate number 6 plastic by looking for the recycle logo with the 6 inside stamped on the plastic itself. It may be on the bottom. Its generally clear plastic used for snack trays, packaging, etc. We used side salad containers which were 3.5 x 3.75in. Our patterns are based on that.
- Trace and color the shapes with markers. Sharpie markers work best.
- Carefully cut out the shapes with scissors. You should have 34 shapes to make the top and bottom of your turtle.
- Place your pieces on aluminum foil and bake in the oven at about 350°F. After the first minute you will see them curl. Don't worry. After about 2-3 minutes, they'll be flat again and won't shrink anymore. Now they're done.
- Use the flat bottom of a cool glass to press on each of the pieces and then lay to cool. This helps make sure they dry flat.
- Assemble the pieces in 3D using a hot glue. Use the photo for reference. Use paint if you like to add additional deatails to your turtle masterpiece. Enjoy!
